

Iowa State Has A New Home with the help of TBHC and TEF (continued)

The opportunity to purchase a Chapter Home anywhere can be a staggering effort in any location. Many obstacles must be overcome, and these can be insurmountable for the inexperienced.

In the lowa State case, a very rare opportunity presented itself just as the Chapter was installed:

- A state-of-the-art fraternity house, newly built just four years ago
- Just across the street from the campus
- Popular suite-style floor plan with living for up to 55 men

The circumstances motivating the sale required Triangle to come up with a very attractive plan very quickly. Otherwise, the opportunity would slip away just as quickly as it had appeared.

The Iowa State Chapter, in association with the TBHC, the TEF and assistance from Iowa State Alumni, came up with a plan in a matter of days:

- \$2.5 million from TBHC
- \$1 million from the Iowa State Chapter and its alumni
- \$1 million from TEF

The latter two were transferred to TBHC to present a single cash offer with no contingencies to the owner within a matter of days — unheard of in commercial real estate, but necessary to thwart any other potential offers.

The final loan from TBHC will be paid off by the lowa State Chapter via a fundraising campaign and other financing within the next 18 months.



Historic Flooding in Houghton, MI Michigan Tech Chapter Emerges Sans Composites

From June 15-17 this year, the Upper Peninsula of Michigan saw immense rainfalls, up to 3-7 inches in some areas. This caused widespread damage throughout the Keweenaw Peninsula and the Michigan Tech Campus. Although many properties experienced flooding and damage from the runoff, the Michigan Tech Chapter and all of its Brothers made it through the storm with only minor flooding. However, many composites were damaged in the storm. The Chapter will be reaching out to alumni to start a composite restoration effort shortly.
